Authority

This permit authorises the permit holder and authorised persons listed on the permit to possess and use firearms acquired by the business under section 31 of the *Firearms Act 1996* modified to emit a laser or infra-red beam specified on this permit for the purpose of conducting gaming activities at approved premises.

This permit also authorises the permit holder and authorised persons listed on the permit to possess and use authorised imitation firearms for the purpose of conducting gaming activities at approved premises.

This permit also authorises possession and use of the firearms by persons 18 years and over participating in gaming activities under the supervision of the permit holder, or authorised person listed on this permit at the approved premises.

The authority conferred by this permit is subject to the *Firearms Act 1996*, the general legislative requirements applicable to a firearm permit holder², and conditions specified in this permit in accordance with clause 25(1)(a) of the Regulation.

It is the responsibility of the permit holder to understand the general legislative requirements applicable to a firearm permit holder, and in the event of any conflict or inconsistency between the general legislative requirements and the conditions imposed under clause 25(1)(a), the conditions outlined in this permit will take precedence.

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Conditions

1. Category A and Category B firearms authorised by this permit must be stored in compliance with the safe storage requirements prescribed by section 40 of the *Firearms Act 1996*³ and the associated Regulation to prevent any firearms from being lost, stolen, or coming into the possession of an unauthorised person.
2. Category C, D & H firearms authorised by this permit must be stored in compliance with the safe storage requirements prescribed by section 41 of the *Firearms Act 1996*⁴ and the associated Regulation to prevent any firearms from being lost, stolen, or coming into the possession of an unauthorised person.
3. Prohibited firearms authorised by this permit must be stored in compliance with the safe storage requirements for prohibited firearms⁵.
4. The permit holder must comply with the transportation requirements prescribed by Clause 149 of the *Firearms Regulation 2017*.
5. Gaming activities may only be conducted at the premises approved by the Firearms Registry and specified in this permit.
6. All activities must be conducted with proper regard for the preservation of public safety.
7. The permit holder must permit the inspection of the premises specified in the permit by a police officer or other approved person at any time.
8. The permit holder or other authorised person specified in this permit must be in attendance at all times when gaming activities are conducted at the approved premises.
9. The permit holder must keep a register of all persons possessing and using the firearms as part of the gaming activities. The register must be bound or scanned and include the **name, date of birth, address and driver licence or passport number** for each player and include details of the periods of time each firearm was removed from safe storage.
10. Permit holder must ensure all participants are briefed on the need for full identity information.
11. The permit holder is responsible for ensuring all mandatory fields are completed accurately on the register prior to giving possession of the laser firearms to the participant.
12. Laser shooting cannot commence until all players are fully recorded in the register and the permit holder has checked the register for accuracy.

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Conditions

13. Permit holder must ensure participants are briefed on safety protocols related to avoiding public alarm.
14. The permit holder is required to submit certified copies of the register upon request by the Firearms Registry or a police officer.
15. Player indemnity forms are an approved form for a register provided they contain player details as per condition 9, are bound or scanned within 48 hours of the completion of each game and include information on the periods of time each firearm was removed from safe storage.
16. Registers must be kept in a place of safe keeping separate from the firearms on the approved premises.
17. Registers must be kept for a period of 2 years and be made available immediately upon demand by a police officer or other authorised person.
18. On public land the permit holder is required to provide adequate signage and delineation markers for the game area that clearly identifies the operation of a laser game.
19. For games held on public land, the permit holder is required to issue, and ensure participants wear, high-visibility vests that clearly identifies the players are part of a laser game.
20. This permit remains valid only while the written approval from the local municipal council or statutory authority responsible for use of the land or waterway remains current. The approval must authorise use of the land as a recreational facility for the purpose of conducting gaming activities.

Approved Premises

The following premises are approved for the conduct of laser games in relation to this permit:

Laser games may be conducted on water within Sydney Harbour, for which prior written approval has been obtained from the Local Consent Authority responsible for the control of the water.

Laser games may be conducted on land, for which prior written approval has been obtained from the Local Consent Authority responsible for the control of the land.

The nominated person must notify details of the proposed laser game activities to the police officer in charge of the police station nearest to the approved premises where the activities are to take place at least seven (7) days prior to the activities being conducted.

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Safe Storage Location

For the purpose of this permit the authorised firearms will be stored at:

G06/110 Flora Street Sutherland NSW 2232.

Authorised Firearms

Shotguns registered to this permit that have been rendered permanently inoperable and modified to emit a laser beam less than 1 milliwatt or an infra-red beam.

Laser Sport International - **Imitation Firearms** as defined in section 4D of the *Firearms Act 1996* as an object that, regardless of its colour, weight or composition or the presence or absence of any moveable parts, substantially duplicates in appearances a firearm but that is not a firearm. An imitation firearm does not include anything that is produced and identified as a children's toy.
